Exploring Student Interpretations of Moral Value in 'Slumdog Millionaire'

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Abstract. This research delves into the portrayal of moral values in the renowned movie "Slumdog Millionaire" and their impact on the perceptions of fifth-semester students at Universitas Muhammadiyah Aceh. The study aimed to explore how cinematic representations of moral values could both inspire and educate students. Using a close-ended questionnaire with a Likert scale, data were collected from the students. The questionnaire was designed to assess students' perceptions regarding moral values depicted in the film, including belief in God, hard work, honesty and trustworthiness, perseverance, love and belonging, inspiration, positive thinking, patience, and self-confidence, with responses ranging from 1 (Strongly Disagree) to 5 (Strongly Agree). The research findings suggest that "Slumdog Millionaire" effectively conveys a spectrum of moral values, with belief in God, hard work, and honesty and trustworthiness being the most favorably perceived. Moreover, the film is widely regarded as inspirational, encouraging students to integrate these values into their lives. This study underscores the pivotal role of cinema in shaping students' perceptions of moral values, with "Slumdog Millionaire" emerging as a source of both inspiration and education, illustrating the potential of visual storytelling in imparting essential life lessons among fifth-semester students at Universitas Muhammadiyah Aceh.

Keywords: Moral value, slumdog millionaire, student interpretation

1. Introduction

Film, as a multifaceted art form, is not just an expression of creativity but also a potent tool of communication capable of influencing individuals across all social strata. A prime exemplar of this is the "Slumdog Millionaire," which, beyond its entertaining aspect, showcases surreal visuals capturing the vibrancy and chaos of Mumbai. The movie provides viewers with an immersive experience, connecting them to a world both familiar and foreign. It effectively arouses deep emotions and invites viewers into an authentic dialogue about love, destiny, poverty, and morality. Echoing this sentiment, Febriyanti, Simanjuntak, and Sutrisno (2022) suggested that every film delivers a distinct message to its audience, positioning cinema as a medium for public communication. "Slumdog Millionaire" masterfully conveys its message in a coherent sequence, allowing audiences to decipher both its enthralling story and the profound themes underpinning it. Furthermore, the film is deeply rooted in the traditions, challenges, and social nuances of its setting, offering viewers a glimpse into the intricacies of local life in India.

Building on this notion, Ardeatika and Setiawan (2019) emphasized that film operates as a conduit to relay varied messages to its viewers, achieved through nuanced narrative techniques. Such films become platforms where the artistry and vision of filmmakers come to the fore, enabling them to weave and share their tales. Corroborating the idea of a film's immersive capability, Ginting and Suryani (2022) observed that audiences often resonate with films due to their harmonious fusion of both audiovisual and purely visual elements, as evident in "Slumdog Millionaire."

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Within the tapestry of films like 'Slumdog Millionaire,' there exists a unique story intertwined with profound life lessons and messages. This celebrated movie, for example, not only delivers an engaging narrative but also imparts valuable insights into the human experience.

Movies are potent vessels for conveying moral messages, and their influence on shaping perceptions can be paralleled with the fundamental mission of the education system: instilling moral values in students. Within the sphere of moral education, the objective is to mold students with virtues that ensure they embody these principles throughout their future endeavors. Morality serves as a guiding force in our lives, directing individuals in societal integration, with these values acting as crucial benchmarks for personal conduct. As expressed by Chowdhury (2016), morality, rooted in our inherent values, guides how we respond to various circumstances and stimuli, while societal norms, defined as foundational guidelines for human behavior, are known as values. These moral values, much like the central yardstick for daily interactions, permeate diverse aspects of life, extending to social interactions, sports, arts, and even literature. Furthermore, Inayyah and Simanjuntak (2022) aptly notes that values are intangible and exist within the realm of human interactions, underscoring the significance of recognizing and comprehending their impact on life. In moral education, as highlighted by George and Uyanga (2014), moral values are underscored as desirable, cherished, and beneficial traits that contribute to the formation of a strong character.

According to (Bastian et al., 2021) moral values are ideas about living a good life that are expressed as principles. As a result, moral education concentrates on principles such as accountability, integrity, and respect for others. It means that moral values are abstract concepts that revolve around the idea of leading a virtuous life. Therefore, moral education places its emphasis on fundamental principles, including responsibility, honesty, and showing consideration for others. In simpler terms, moral values are the guiding notions for living a good and ethical life, and moral education helps instill these principles, such as being responsible, truthful, and respectful towards others.

Building upon the captivating power of cinema to reflect societal values, this study delves into the intricate layers of the globally recognized film "Slumdog Millionaire." At the heart of this exploration is the film's protagonist, whose actions, choices, and dilemmas bring forth a rich tapestry of moral principles that are both relatable and thought-provoking. By meticulously analyzing these aspects, the research aims to provide readers not just with a deeper understanding of the film, but also with a mirror to reflect upon their own moral compass. In a world brimming with diverse viewpoints and perceptions, movies like "Slumdog Millionaire" serve as poignant reminders of the importance of ethics and morality. By acquainting oneself with the moral underpinnings in such narratives, individuals can be better equipped to navigate their own lives in ways that are both respectful and commendable.

2. Method

In this research, a descriptive qualitative approach was employed to thoroughly investigate the perceptions of fifth-semester students from the English department at Universitas Muhammadiyah Aceh regarding the moral values presented in the film "Slumdog Millionaire." The students were given access to the movie and subsequently provided with a soft-copy questionnaire via WhatsApp to capture their interpretations and opinions. The questionnaire, featuring close-ended questions on a Likert Scale, served as the primary data collection instrument, with students' responses being the main source of

data. In addition to the students' insights, various print and digital resources, including references, journals, and dictionaries, were used to supplement the analysis. The research process encompassed several stages, including watching the film, designing and distributing the questionnaire, and systematically analyzing the students' responses to gain a comprehensive understanding of the moral values depicted in the movie.

3. Results and Discussions

Moral values, serving as standards or principles, define the boundary between morally acceptable and unacceptable conduct. These values are not fixed but rather influenced by the culture, group, or community to which we belong. They can be best described as moral guidelines, customs, and principles that have direct applications in our daily lives. According to Nadeak et al. (2020), these moral values, representing the fundamental principles of right and wrong behavior, serve as the cornerstone of both society and human existence. In this context, "human" refers to people and their actions, which can carry positive or negative implications.

To analyze the moral values portrayed in a film, it is essential to comprehend the real-life counterparts of the characters and engage in a meticulous examination of the moral lessons conveyed by the film. Subsequently, the researcher should present their findings and insights drawn from this comprehensive analysis.

The moral principles extracted from this film are as follows:

1. Faith (Believe in God)

The concept of "God" varies among different cultures, religions, and belief systems. In monotheistic religions such as Islam, Christianity, and Judaism, God is often seen as a singular, all-powerful, and all-knowing deity who is the creator of the universe and the source of moral and spiritual guidance. In polytheistic religions like Hinduism, there are multiple gods and goddesses, each with specific attributes and roles. Marlina et al. (2021) expresses those ethical values ingrained in society and religion are frequently entwined with morality. Moral teachings that emphasize obedience to a divine entity (God) and encourage people to act morally both in their personal lives and in their interactions with others are shared by people of many different faiths around the world.

The characters' unique viewpoints and experiences are reflected in these exchanges, which include acts of kindness and goodwill offered in God's name, the belief that some events in life are predetermined, and the discovery of emotional meaning and thankfulness in divine intervention. According to the data, the characters in the story have different levels of faith, and their beliefs have a big impact on how they behave, feel, and relate to each other.

2. Work Hard

Working hard means exerting a great deal of effort and diligence in order to complete

tasks or reach objectives. To attain the intended outcomes, it necessitates the allocation of time, effort, and devotion and frequently calls for persistence, concentration, and resolve. To work hard is to go above and beyond what is generally expected in order to achieve a higher level of success or quality in one's endeavors. People needed to recognize the importance of diligent effort as a pathway to a better life (George and Uyanga 2014). Rosalinah et al., (2021) also claimed that working hard is a sign of genuine resolve to overcome difficulties and hurdles in order to complete tasks completely and successfully.

These exchanges show Jamal working at different jobs, including that of a street vendor in Mumbai with Salim, a photographer at the Taj Mahal, and a restaurant employee in the city prior to meeting Latika. These scenes show different facets of Jamal's work history and the range of roles he has held throughout his career, illustrating his journey and ability to adapt to different work environments.

3. Honesty and Trustworthy

Honesty is a fundamental aspect of trustworthiness. George and Uyanga (2014) mentioned that it takes courage to be open, direct, and truthful when communicating to be considered honest. To speak your mind without fear of upsetting someone's ego requires courage. Beyond not contradicting oneself, being honest also means remaining consistent in your words, actions, and thoughts. Nadeak et al. (2020) added that being honest is a behavior that centers on the pursuit of being a reliable person in both words and actions. This sincere attitude necessitates respecting others in line with human values and a mental and spiritual connection with them.

Table 3 provides insights into Jamal's honesty and trustworthiness throughout the narrative. Initially introducing himself truthfully during a quiz show, he later candidly admits not knowing an answer and relies on a lifeline for assistance, reinforcing his commitment to honesty. Furthermore, Jamal clarifies his job role, describing himself as an assistant without embellishment. Lastly, Latika's affirmation of Jamal's goodness

and trustworthiness underscores the faith and trust others place in him. These dialogues collectively depict Jamal as a consistently truthful and trustworthy character in the story.

4. Love and Belonging

Human well-being depends on love and belonging, which include the need to feel included and accepted in relationships and social groups as well as emotional ties to other people. These needs are fundamental to the formation of a person's identity and general well-being. Marlina et al. (2021) affirmed that love should have no boundaries and shouldn't cause harm to other people. This context shows that love is not just about romantic relationships but also about showing compassion and caring for all living things. Genuine and altruistic love is a powerful force that attracts other people's affection and love as well.

Table 4 centers on the narrative theme of love and belonging. The intensity of Jamal's emotions is highlighted when he tells the police that Latika is the most beautiful woman on the planet, expressing his deep love for her. Additionally, he shows how much he cares for Latika by threatening to take drastic measures to keep their relationship safe. On the other hand, Latika's request that Jamal forgets about her emphasizes her love and worry for his security because she worries that Javed may hurt him. Together, these exchanges highlight Jamal and Latika's deep and complicated love as well as their need for safety and belonging in the face of the difficult circumstances they encounter in the narrative.

5. Inspiration

Inspiration is a strong and frequently uplifting force that inspires or drives original ideas, actions, or thoughts. It can originate from multiple sources and take on diverse forms. For problem-solving, creative expression, personal development, and other endeavors, inspiration can act as a stimulant. Hogarty (2022) claimed that experiencing inspiration in both our personal lives and at work plays a vital role in maintaining our motivation. A lack of inspiration can signal underlying issues. It emphasizes the importance of feeling inspired both in our personal lives and in our work, as it is a key factor in keeping our motivation levels high.

Table 5 contains dialogues highlighting narrative elements that are inspirational. Jamal's inspirational journey of overcoming adversity is demonstrated by his unwavering commitment to answering every question correctly on the quiz show, his unwavering determination to succeed, and his resolute belief in himself. His frequent allusions to fate allude to a larger theme that runs through the whole movie,

highlighting the notion that life is directed by a higher purpose. Finally, the conversation that questions Maman's pessimistic forecast and highlights Jamal's will to overcome his lowly beginnings best illustrates the motivational theme of overcoming obstacles and aiming for a better life in spite of difficult circumstances. Together, these exchanges highlight the story's inspirational elements by encouraging resiliency, self-belief, and the ability to control one's own fate.

6. Persistence

Being persistent is a quality or state that refers to carrying out an action or pursuing an objective in the face of challenges, setbacks, or recurrent failures. It entails making a consistent, unwavering effort to accomplish a specific goal in the face of obstacles or setbacks. Priyoto & Priskila (2023) claimed that "giving up" entails abandoning our efforts and ceasing our attempts. "Never giving up" implies our unwavering commitment to persist, remaining resilient, staying optimistic, and finding joy in our pursuits.

Table 6 illustrates Jamal's resolute search for Latika throughout the story. He continues to seek out her despite the many challenges he faces. Jamal exhibits tenacity and an unbreakable spirit in everything from his ceaseless attempts to get through in a call center to his continuous questions about Latika's whereabouts with strangers on the streets of Mumbai. He even expresses his desire to look for Latika at Chowpatty, demonstrating his unwavering pursuit. These conversations highlight Jamal's unwavering commitment and determination, as well as the theme of persistence and the lengths he will go to find the woman he loves.

7. Positive Thinking

Positive thinking is a way of thinking that emphasizes concentrating on the positive, constructive aspects of circumstances and events rather than lingering on the negative or possible issues. It entails keeping an optimistic mindset, developing a positive outlook, and facing obstacles with faith that successful results are possible. According to Mayo Clinic (2022) positive thinking involves tackling challenging situations with a constructive and productive mindset, anticipating favorable outcomes rather than dwelling on the negative or unfavorable possibilities.

Table 7 reflects the characters' positive outlook and optimism in a variety of circumstances. Salim, Jamal, and Latika express their belief in the inherent goodness of people in the first dialogue by having a positive view of Maman because he provides care at the orphanage. Jamal's optimistic outlook is demonstrated by his faith that Maman will find his singing enjoyable, even in the face of danger. Ultimately, Jamal's vision of a wealthy future for himself, Latika, and Salim—one that includes a large home—highlights his upbeat attitude and resolve to improve his friends' and his own lives—even in the face of adversity. Together, these exchanges highlight the idea of optimistic thinking and the characters' tenacity in maintaining optimism and hope in the face of hardship.

8. Patience

The capacity to bear hardships and wait for things to happen or change while maintaining composure, tolerance, and calmness is known as patience. It entails having the ability to control oneself, control frustration, and control impulsive behavior. As Wooll (2022) described that patience is the capacity to endure without feeling irritated, agitated, or resentful. It involves practicing self-discipline instead of reacting with frustration or grievances. It highlights that in order to be patient, one must practice self-control and refrain from becoming irritated or complaining in the face of obstacles, delays, or problems. It defines patience, in essence, as the ability to respond to circumstances that might otherwise cause unpleasant feelings in a cool, collected manner.

Jamal's unwavering patience and dedication to his love for Latika are embodied in Table 8. "I will wait for you at the train station at 5 o'clock every day until you come," he says in a dialogue that embodies his unwavering commitment to holding out for Latika. In this one exchange, Jamal shows off his extraordinary endurance by patiently waiting for her at the train station. He shows that he loves her unconditionally and is determined to be with her no matter what challenges they encounter.

9. Self-Confidence

A person who has self-confidence believes in their own skills, traits, and judgment. It is a constructive and grounded self-assurance that enables people to have faith in their ability to meet objectives, overcome obstacles, and effectively navigate circumstances. Yasintawati (2011) emphasizes the importance of believing in one's own abilities and using one's natural skills and talents for positive endeavors. It also acknowledges that people sometimes underestimate their own potential, indicating a lack of self-confidence or belief in their capabilities. In essence, it encourages self-belief and the proactive utilization of one's talents and skills to achieve positive outcomes.

Table 9 demonstrates Jamal's resolute confidence during his appearance on the game show. Jamal constantly exhibits a high degree of confidence in these exchanges. He readily consents to start answering questions, states with assurance that his answers are the only ones available, and confidently answers the queries. Together, these exchanges highlight Jamal's composure and self-assurance throughout the stressful quiz show, demonstrating his faith in his knowledge and capacity to succeed in the face of difficulty.

To help students understand the moral values portrayed in the film 'Slumdog Millionaire' and connect them to the main character, Jamal, it's essential for students to watch the movie attentively. Specific examples from the film can be used to stimulate meaningful discussions and explore the moral values in greater detail. The following are the students' perception of the moral values in the movie "Slumdog Millionaire".

1. Believe in God




Figure 1. Perception of the movie's portrayal of belief in god

In response to the first question regarding the portrayal of belief in God in the movie, the statement garnered significant agreement from 14 respondents, representing 45.2% of students who agreed with it. Additionally, 8 students, or 25.7%, strongly supported the statement. On the other hand, a smaller percentage of respondents, 6.5%, expressed disagreement, and 3.2% strongly disagreed with it. Notably, 19.4% of respondents opted for a neutral response. In summary, the response patterns suggest that a majority of the respondents find the movie effective in conveying the moral value of belief in God.

2. Work Hard




Figure 2. Perception of the movie's emphasis on hard work

Regarding the second question concerning the significance of hard work, the statement garnered substantial support. Specifically, 42% of students strongly agreed with it, while an additional 38.7%, or 13 individuals, expressed their agreement. Conversely, a smaller segment of respondents, accounting for 12.9%, remained neutral on the subject, and 3.2% indicated disagreement. An even smaller fraction, 3.2%, selected the option of strongly disagreeing. In summary, the response patterns indicate that the movie effectively conveys the moral value of hard work and is widely recognized as doing so by the majority of the respondents.

3. Honest and trustworthy




Figure 3. Perception of the movie's portrayal of honesty and trustworthiness

Concerning question number three, which delves into the portrayal of honesty and trustworthiness in the movie, the data reveals significant agreement among respondents. A noteworthy 41.8% of students expressed strong agreement with the statement, and an additional 32.3% (10 students) conveyed their agreement. Interestingly, a portion of respondents, representing 19.4%, remained neutral in their stance, while 6.5% expressed disagreement. Notably, no students opted for the option of strongly disagreeing. In summary, the data suggests that a substantial majority of the respondents recognize and appreciate the movie's effective portrayal of the moral values of honesty and trustworthiness.

4. Persistence




Figure 4. Perception of the movie's emphasis on persistence and resilience

In relation to question number four, which addresses the value of persistence in the film, the data reveals a striking level of agreement among respondents. Significantly, 41.9% of students expressed strong agreement with the statement, and an additional 25.8% (8 students) conveyed their agreement. It is worth noting that a segment of respondents, constituting 22.6%, maintained a neutral standpoint, while 9.7% indicated disagreement. Notably, none of the students selected the option of strongly disagreeing. In summary, the response patterns strongly indicate that a substantial majority of the respondents wholeheartedly recognize the movie's effective portrayal of the moral value of persistence and not giving up.

5. Love and belonging




Figure 5. Perception of the movie's emphasis on love and belonging

In response to question number five, which delves into the themes of love and belonging in the film, the data indicates that the majority of respondents maintained a favorable stance. Notably, 38.7% of students adopted a neutral position, reflecting the complexity of the theme. Furthermore, 32.3% (10 students) expressed their agreement with the statement. It's noteworthy that 19.3% strongly agreed, underscoring the resonance of the theme with a significant portion of the respondents. A smaller segment, 3.2%, chose the option of disagreement, while 6.5% of students indicated a stronger disagreement. In summary, the response patterns suggest that the movie effectively conveys the moral value of love and belonging, resonating with the majority of respondents.

6. Inspiration

In response to question number seven, which explores the inspirational aspects of the movie, the data reveals a notable level of resonance among respondents. Remarkably, 35.5% of students strongly agreed with the statement, underlining the movie's capacity to inspire. Furthermore, 29% (9 students) expressed their agreement with the

statement, indicating a substantial alignment with the movie's inspirational content. Notably, 25.8% of respondents maintained a neutral stance, suggesting the diverse perceptions of inspiration in the film. A smaller segment, 6.5%, indicated strong disagreement, and 3.2% chose the option of disagreement. In summary, the response patterns imply that the movie effectively conveys the moral value of inspiration, with a significant majority of respondents acknowledging its inspirational elements.




Figure 6. Perception of the movie as a source of inspiration

7. Positive thinking




Figure 7. Perception of the movie's emphasis on positive thinking and optimism

Concerning question number seven, which pertains to the importance of positive thinking in the movie, the data reveals substantial agreement among respondents. Impressively, 51.6% of students expressed their agreement with the statement, indicating the movie's powerful message regarding positive thinking. Additionally, 22.6% (7 students) maintained a neutral stance, showcasing a spectrum of perspectives on this aspect. Importantly, 12.9% expressed strong agreement, highlighting the significant influence of positive thinking within the film's narrative. Notably, none of the students opted for the option of strongly disagreeing. However, a small fraction, 12.9%, chose the option of disagreeing, indicating some diversity in viewpoints. In summary, the response patterns strongly suggest that the movie effectively conveys the moral value of positive thinking, resonating with the majority of respondents.

8. Patient




Figure 8. Perception of the movie's emphasis on patience and resilience

In response to question number eight, which addresses the value of patience in the film, the data reveals a significant level of agreement among respondents. Impressively, 50% of students expressed their agreement with the statement, highlighting the movie's effective portrayal of patience. Additionally, 22% (7 students) adopted a neutral standpoint, illustrating a range of perspectives on this aspect. 9. Self-Confidence




Figure 9. Perception of the movie's portrayal of self-confidence

10. Overall perception




Figure 10. Overall rating of 'slumdog millionaire' in conveying moral values
