- d. Using media/sources, by being able to recognize, select, and use learning supports, in the form of aids, libraries, computer technology, or laboratories properly according to needs;
- e. Mastering the educational foundation, as a foundation and acting educatively in every situation in an effort to manage teaching and learning interactions;
- f. Managing teaching and learning interactions is an ability that must be possessed by teachers in an effort to transform knowledge and internalize values to students. Teacher skills, teaching methods, facilities, and tools or supporting technology are important components for successful management;
- g. Assessing student achievement for teaching purposes is the ability to recognize student potential, analyze, and use student learning outcomes data as feedback for each student:

- i. Knowing and implementing school administration is the ability to carry out administrative activities such as recording and reporting student learning outcomes.
- j. Understanding the principles and interpreting the results of teacher research for teaching purposes, is the ability to understand matters relating to reasoning to grow students' reasoning and develop the teaching and learning process. (Sadirman, 2001: 161).
